



Life in the City of Gosnells



The new Mills Park Library in Beckenham is now open for business, offering residents a vibrant and modern facility designed with an emphasis on technology.

Visitors to the library can access loans, public computers and Wi-Fi, study and reading areas. Community programs will be on offer inside the library and in other rooms at the Mills Park Centre, starting with Story Time and Toddler Time.

Library members will benefit from the new library's location at the heart of the Mills Park Centre, alongside existing facilities including a children's nature play area, function rooms, a skate plaza, tennis and basketball courts, sports fields and a popular café.

The \$1 million project includes \$540,000 funded by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, as part of the Australian Government's plan to stimulate local economies and assist recovery from the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mills Park Library will be open seven days a week.

Clearing and drainage work has begun as part of the duplication of Warton Road between Ranford Road and Nicholson Road in Canning Vale.

Once complete, the \$5.4 million upgrade will allow over 16,000 cars to travel the road each day. A two-metre wide median strip will be included.

The project is part funded by the City with other funding from the State Government and the City of Armadale, and will be completed within the next 12 months.

The City has worked closely with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation to minimise the impact of the construction on the nearby banksia woodland and to ensure any clearing is handled carefully.

The adjacent part of Warton Road in the City of Armadale has already been duplicated.
