







Life in the City of Gosnells

Homestead Park upgrade complete

Community members recently celebrated the reopening of Thornlie's Homestead Park with a range of Park Play activities, farm animals and a visit from The Nomad wandering youth space.

The major upgrade reflects the site's history and capitalises on its prime location near the Canning River. It includes barbecues, picnic areas, seating, paths, a basketball half-court, turf kick-about area, landscaping, bike racks and an extensive playground that features a herd of carved pigs.

The playground design was inspired by the remnants of what is thought to be a piggery wall found onsite and olive trees, planted in 1837, that are still growing

Two flying foxes stretch from the top of the hill to the playground area, providing plenty of entertainment for kids of all ages.

The \$920,000 upgrade was jointly funded by the City of Gosnells and a \$680,000 grant from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, as part of the Australian Government's COVID-19 economic stimulus plan.

Homestead Park was previously the site of Thornlie Homestead, which was built in the 1880s and was one of the first European homes in the area.

I must say, it is great to be a part of well-functioning Council. This past year we have worked together to ensure the City's strategic direction aligns with our community's expectations. We have listened to community feedback and identified waste, security, community facilities and the environment as priorities.

Behind the scenes, we have been working with Police to identify the best way to tackle crime and will soon launch a rebate scheme to make CCTV more affordable for residents.

We are working on plans to build a new aquatic and recreation centre and redevelop Sutherlands Park in Southern River to cater for the growing population.
