City turns sod at Sutherlands Park

Construction is starting on the largest City of Gosnells investment in sport and recreation, which will transform the 67-hectare reserve at Sutherlands Park, Huntingdale, into a one-stop sport and recreation hub for the rapidly growing community over the coming years.

Sutherlands Park features seven sports reserves, three pavilions, a community centre, two playgrounds, a synthetic hockey ground, indoor cricket training facility, and a Bush Forever environmental site.

The Sutherlands Park Master Plan addresses the needs and expected growth of our local sporting clubs, including a commitment for a much-needed aquatic facility that will service the region.

The Master Plan was developed in consultation with key sports clubs that use the park and includes new sports club spaces and a new configuration of sports ovals, Youth Entertainment Space (YES), a pump track, all-abilities playground, a commitment for the Sutherlands Park Leisure, Aquatic and Sports Hub (SPLASH), a new Huntingdale Community Centre and an enclosed dog park.

Construction will begin with the all-abilities playground and car park off Holmes Street. Part of the reserve will be fenced off during construction and the City thanks local residents for their understanding and patience during this time.

Calling all artists

Showcasing art and artists from local suburbs and further afield, the annual competition and exhibition has a total prize pool of \$10,000.

In addition to the \$5,000 acquisitive prize for the overall award winner, there are 10 categories, with a \$500 prize offered for each, including Acrylic; Pastel, Pencil, Pen and Watercolour; Oil; Photography and Digital Media; Mixed Media and Three-Dimensional Sculpture; Youth Award (12 – 17 years); The City in Focus Award, Centuria People's Choice Award, and Local Artist Award. This year, there is also a new Aboriginal Artist category.
